Genesis 9 (KJV):28 And Noah lived after the flood three hundred and fifty years. 29 So all the days of Noah were nine hundred and fifty years; and he died.

The flood happened 1656 years after Adam was born, according to the Biblical chronology.

Genesis 11 (KJV): 10 These are the generations of Shem: Shem was an hundred years old, and begat Arphaxad two years after the flood: 11 And Shem lived after he begat Arphaxad five hundred years, and begat sons and daughters. 12 And Arphaxad lived five and thirty years, and begat Salah: 13 And Arphaxad lived after he begat Salah four hundred and three years, and begat sons and daughters. 14 And Salah lived thirty years, and begat Eber: 15 And Salah lived after he begat Eber four hundred and three years, and begat sons and daughters. 16 And Eber lived four and thirty years, and begat Peleg: 17 And Eber lived after he begat Peleg four hundred and thirty years, and begat sons and daughters. 18 And Peleg lived thirty years, and begat Reu: 19 And Peleg lived after he begat Reu two hundred and nine years, and begat sons and daughters. 20 And Reu lived two and thirty years, and begat Serug: 21 And Reu lived after he begat Serug two hundred and seven years, and begat sons and daughters. 22 And Serug lived thirty years, and begat Nahor: 23 And Serug lived after he begat Nahor two hundred years, and begat sons and daughters. 24 And Nahor lived nine and twenty years, and begat Terah: 25 And Nahor lived after he begat Terah an hundred and nineteen years, and begat sons and daughters.

Genesis 12 (KJV):1 Now the Lord had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee: 2 And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing: 3 And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed. 4 So Abram departed, as the Lord had spoken unto him; and Lot went with him: and Abram was seventy and five years old when he departed out of Haran.

Genesis 16 (KJV): 15 And Hagar bare Abram a son: and Abram called his son's name, which Hagar bare, Ishmael. 16 And Abram was fourscore and six years old, when Hagar bare Ishmael to Abram.

Abram was born 292 years after the flood according to the Biblical chronology. Abram was 75 when he left Haran (Genesis 12:4). This would have been 367 years after the flood.

Abram was 86 when his son Ishmael was born (Genesis 16:16).
Abraham was 100 when his son Isaac was born (Genesis 21:5). This would have been 392 years after the flood.
Abraham was 175 when he died (Genesis 25:7).
Genesis 25 (KJV):20 And Isaac was forty years old when he took Rebekah to wife, the daughter of Bethuel the Syrian of Padanaram, the sister to Laban the Syrian. 21 And Isaac intreated the Lord for his wife, because she was barren: and the Lord was intreated of him, and Rebekah his wife conceived.

Genesis 35 (KJV):28 And the days of Isaac were an hundred and fourscore years.
Genesis 37 (KJV):9 And Jacob said unto Pharaoh, The days of the years of my pilgrimage are an hundred and thirty years: few and evil have the days of the years of my life been, and have not attained unto the days of the years of the life of my fathers in the days of their pilgrimage.

Genesis 37 (KJV):28 And Jacob lived in the land of Egypt seventeen years: so the whole age of Jacob was an hundred forty and seven years.

Abram was born in 1948, which is 292 years after the flood in 1656 according to the Biblical chronology.
Isaac was 40 when he married Rebekah (Genesis 25:20).
Isaac died at the age of 180 (Genesis 35:28).
Isaac must have been about 50 when Jacob and Esau were born because
Jacob went into Egypt at the age of 130 (Genesis 37:9).
Jacob and Esau were twins, and must have been born at least 10 years after Isaac married Rebekah because Isaac died in Genesis 35:28, and Jacob was not in Egypt until Genesis 37:9.

God first told Abraham to leave his country and relatives when he was in Mesopotamia, as Stephen notes in Acts 7 (NASB): 2 And Stephen said, "Listen to me, brothers and fathers! The God of glory appeared to our father Abraham when he was in Mesopotamia, before he lived in Haran, 3 and He said to him, 'Go from your country and your relatives, and come to the land which I will show you.' 4 Then he left the land of the

Chaldeans and settled in Haran. And from there, after his father died, God had him move to this country in which you are now living.

Now then, because in Genesis 12:1-4 God told Abraham to leave Haran when he was 75 years old, this would have been in 2023, and probably would begin the Dispensation of Promise. Jacob would then be in Egypt in 2228 approximately. This would be 205 years after Abraham had left Haran.

Israel was to be afflicted in Egypt for 400 years, as we read in Genesis 15 (KJV):13 And he said unto Abram, Know of a surety that thy seed shall be a stranger in a land that is not theirs, and shall serve them; and they shall afflict them four hundred years;

Israel was "afflicted" in Egypt for 400 years, but was in Egypt a total of 430 years, as we read in Exodus 12 (KJV):40 Now the sojourning of the children of Israel, who dwelt in Egypt, was four hundred and thirty years. 41 And it came to pass at the end of the four hundred and thirty years, even the selfsame day it came to pass, that all the hosts of the Lord went out from the land of Egypt.

This would make the Dispensation of Promise at least 205 plus 430, or 605 years long. The giving of the law occurred when Israel was in the wilderness in Exodus 20. So the Dispensation of the Law would have begun at some point after the 605 years.
